

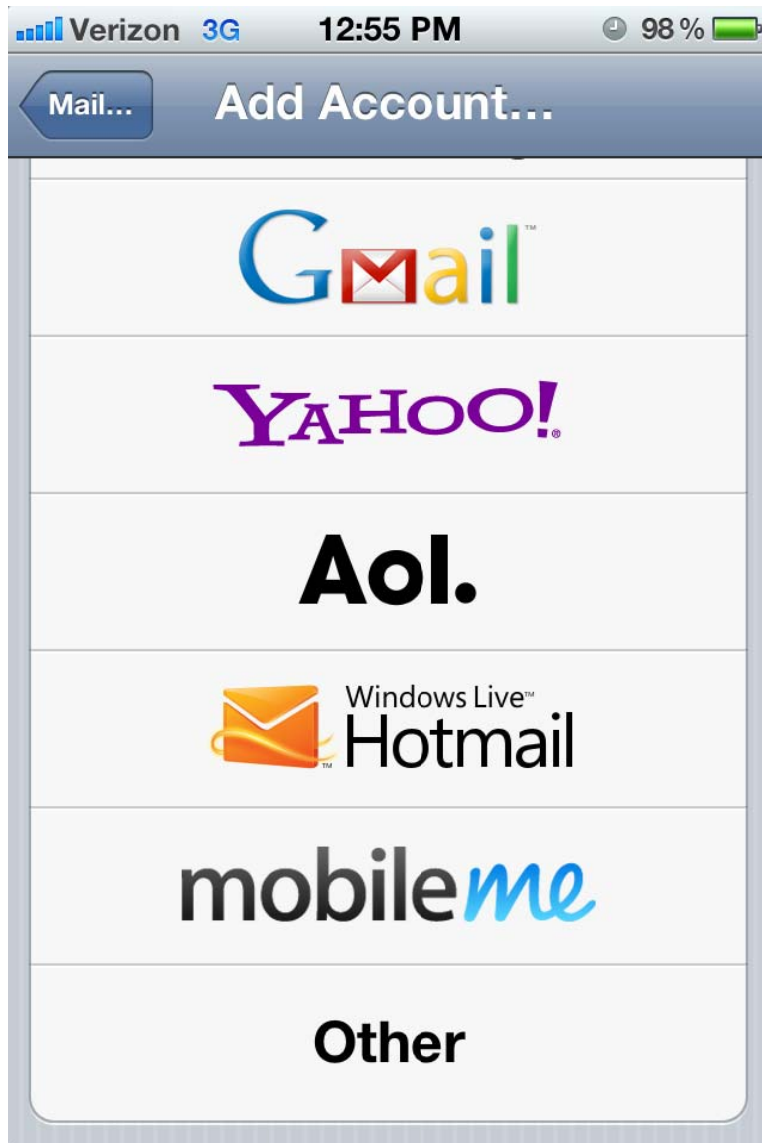
Go to Settings: Click on Mail, Contacts, Calendars

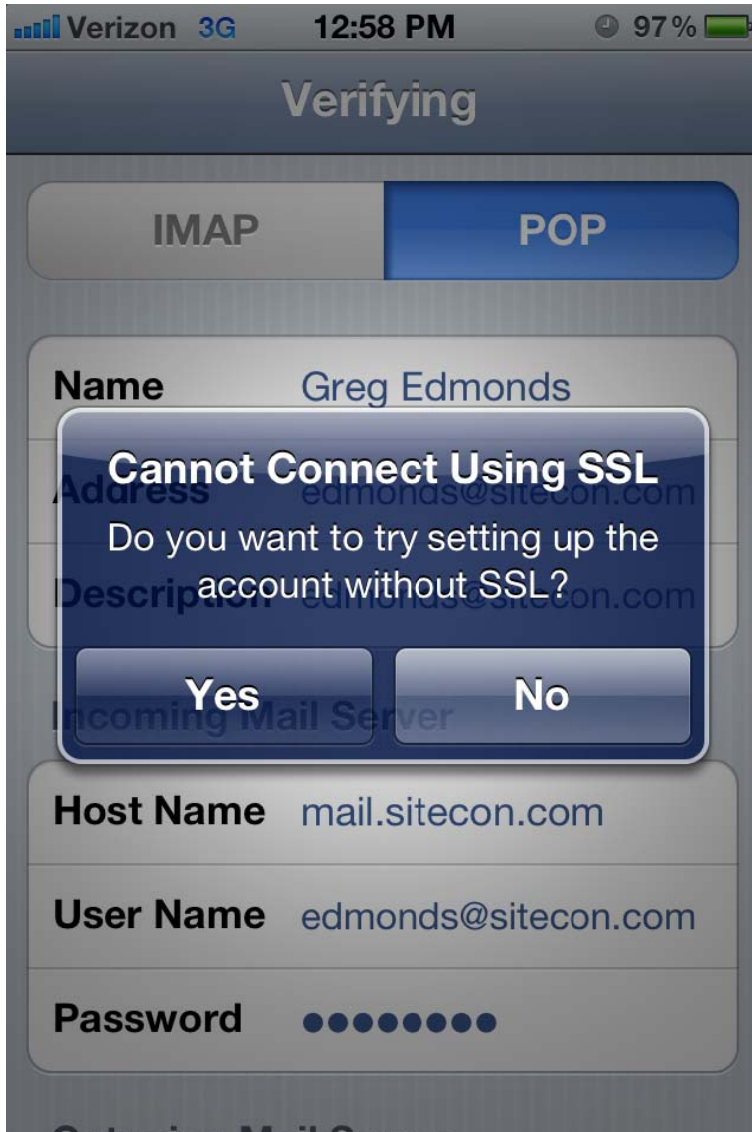
